RE: **Child Care Support for Families Up to 200% FPL and Earning up \$75,000**

On Friday, Aug. 28, Governor Murphy released details on the State’s plan to provide subsidies to working families in need of child care in light of remote and hybrid learning plans announced by school districts for the upcoming school year. The announcement included two initiatives:

1. The state’s **Child Care Subsidy Program (CCSP)** will provide child care subsidies for children aged 5-13 through the end of the calendar year for families earning up to 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL). This subsidy will be expanded to provide subsidies during the school day when children are *normally* in a school setting. Pasted below is the 2020 FPL guidelines.

2. For **families who don’t qualify for CCSP** but are in need of child care due to their children’s school’s remote learning, a new program will be available for families with annual **incomes below \$75,000** through an application process. Funding will be provided directly to the child’s licensed child care center or registered family child care and providers will be paid the state’s subsidy rate based on the hours of care needed. **Applications will open in early September.**
